Participants will explore how businesses and financial actors can contribute data, what barriers limit their involvement, and what is needed to engage them effectively. The discussion will also address gaps in socio-economic and coastal resilience data, strategies for data collection and sharing, and how to align efforts with monitoring and investment planning.</p>

Participants will examine how sectors, private and public actors can collaborate more effectively, how multi-use infrastructure can help resolve spatial conflicts, and how MSP can serve as a coordinating framework across EU policies and sectors.</p>
